



Writing types (WT) Non-narrative	Information Write a simple non-chronological report by writing sentences to describe aspects of the subject.		Instruction Write simple instructions for a purpose including <ul style="list-style-type: none"> statement of purpose list of materials or ingredients, sequential steps direct/imperative language use of adjectives and adverbs limited to giving essential information
Writing types (WT) Narrative	Written stories which innovate on known stories using substitution or change of viewpoint by boxing up.	Recount simple first person recounts linked to topics of interest/study or to personal experience, using the language of texts read as models for own writing, maintaining consistency in tense and person.	Story types: Losing Tale Rag to Riches story Journey Tale Character Flaw story
