




Reception – Home learning challenge 13

Monday	The tiny hermit crab loves his new shell and doesn't want to share it at first in the story. Have you got a favourite toy that you really love and find hard to share? Can you draw a picture of it and write a few sentences about what makes it special to you?	
Tuesday	See if you can design an even bigger shell for the hermit crab and his friends to share. Either add some labels to it or write a few sentences to describe the new design.	
Wednesday	In the story, the hermit crab shares his home with his friends. Who do you share your home with? Can you draw a picture of your home and write about who lives in it with you?	
Thursday	The bristle worm is really good at looking after the shell and keeping it clean, to make it feel like home for his friends. How do you help take care of your home?	
Friday	Make a list of the rhyming words in the story.	

Understanding the World		<p>3. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=bJVK0lwmlg0</p> <p>The rock pool is the habitat where the 3 sea creatures in this week's story live. Can you research rock pools and find out what other sea creatures like to live there?</p>
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Maths	Sharing	<p>4.</p> <p>Last week, we looked at sharing numbers equally by halving. This week, we will practise sharing between more than two people. Practise sharing things around your home with people in your house and then try one of the different activities each day below!</p>
Monday	Abed has 3 rabbits who love eating carrots. He has 6 carrots to share between them. How many carrots will each rabbit have? Draw 3 rabbits and share out the 6 carrots to check.	
Tuesday	Share out 15 biscuits between your 5 favourite toys. How many biscuits does each toy have? Is it fair?	
Wednesday	Cut up an apple with an adult into 8 slices. If you shared it equally between yourself and a friend, How many pieces would you have each?	
Thursday	If a packet has 20 sweets in and you share them between you and 3 friends, how many will you each get? Draw 20 sweets on a sheets of paper, equally sharing them into the 4 corners of the paper.	
Friday	A squirrel had 10 nuts to share between her 5 babies. How many nuts will each baby have? Draw the nuts to check.
