



Writing types (WT) Non-narrative	<b>Information</b> Plan, compose, edit and refine non-chronological report focusing on clarity, conciseness and impersonal style.	<b>Instruction</b> instructions which are for more complex procedures , or are combined with other text types	<b>Persuasion</b> write letters for real purposes, e.g. put a point of view, comment on an emotive issue, protest, using formal language where appropriate, may be incorporated into or combined with other text types	<b>Discussion</b> write a balanced report of a controversial issue: – summarising fairly the competing views – drawing reasoned conclusions where appropriate
Writing types (WT) Narrative	Written stories which innovate on known stories using substitution or change of viewpoint by boxing up.  Invention of stories using previously learned plot structures	<b>Recount</b> sports reports, diaries, police reports, including introduction to set the scene, chronological sequence, varied but consistent use of past tense, formality and effective use of adverbials and conjunctions.	<b>Story Types:</b> Finding tale Character Flaw Tale Journey Tale
